

Art Focus: Wayne Thiebaud





Taking inspiration from American Pop Artist Wayne Thiebaud why not create your own food themed pop art piece. He took everyday objects such as food and exaggerated the colours playing with light and dark to form shapes - we wanted to also look at mark making!

Tools and Materials:


- Paper
- Marker Pens or Felt Tips



For this craft we looked at different images of paintings by Wayne Thiebaud - he did a lot of sweet treats like cakes, gumballs and ice cream - so we thought ice cream would be fun to recreate in our own way! Because you would be able to see pencil lines through the marker pens we decided to jump straight into it with the markers, you can always tweak things when you are adding in the background if there are lines you don't like. Sketch out our image with one of the light colour marker pens like so



Use your marker pens to create different lengths of lines for the ice cream but also the background, varying thickness and colour to build up depth in your work



There is no right or wrong in this because the colours are beyond reality so just enjoy the process, you can really let loose with mark making to create your piece! Layering colours over each other to make new shades and a tonality in your work
